We the Committee of the Town of Easthampton being thoroughly convinced of the Injurious and Criminal Tendency of our former Meetings and Resolutions, and willing to manifest our hearty Disapprobation of all such Illegal Measures, Do hereby dissolve this Committee, and as far as in us lies, Revoke and Disannul all former Orders and Resolutions of this Committee, and we do further hereby renounce and disavow the Orders and Resolutions of all other Committees and Congresses whatsoever, as being undutifull to our lawful Sovereign, repugnant to the Principles of the British Constitution, and Ruinous in the Extream to the Happiness and Prosperity of this Town.
